1. Hand out or show following worksheet to your students:

NOUNS	VERBS	ADJECTIVES

2. Explain to your students that you will read out a passage of a contemporary fiction novel. Give them a few more information about the story that is then followed by the text. (chose option 1 or option 2)

*Option 1*

*Three teenage boys were on a hiking trip in the Peak District when they were surprised by a storm. They were able to find shelter in a nearby farm. As their phones had no reception, they were not able to contact their parents to let them know that they were safe. Returning was also not a possibility as the roads were flooded. A police search began and luckily the boys were located.*

*Option 2*

*At the farm the three boys were looked after by a man called Marty. He has only met a few people of the village Rockshore and is looking for the owner of the corner shop called Tilly.*

Now read out the text below **once** and ask your students to write down all the nouns they can hear.

Read out the passage a **second time** and ask them to note down all the verbs they can hear.

Finally read out the text a **third time** and this time your students should pay attention to the adjectives. It might be advisable to explain the difference between adjectives and adverbs at this point. For a lower level of class, point out that there are 4 adjectives in the passage.

As a **final task** put the students in pairs or groups and let them reconstruct the passage with the help of the nouns, verbs and adjectives they had written down.

### Adjectives vs Adverbs

An adjective is a word that modifies a noun or a pronoun (he, him, his....). It provides more information about the noun/ pronoun.

*He wears a **yellow** coat.      She looks at the **pretty** tree.*

An adverb is a word that modifies a verb, an adjective, a clause. Often answers questions such as When?, Where?, How?, Why?

*Today it rained **heavily**.      She sang **quietly**.*

Option 1 – B1 level

Theresa Harding returned to the lounge and repeated what DS Campbell just told her. "You were right Mr Lewis and Mr Jones. The three boys were so far gone on their hike when the storm surprised them that returning was not an option and they did make their way to Clifton House. There was a man there who looked after the farm and once the boys turned up he looked after them and made sure they were save from the storm. Option 2 – B2 level or higher
